### TRAIN

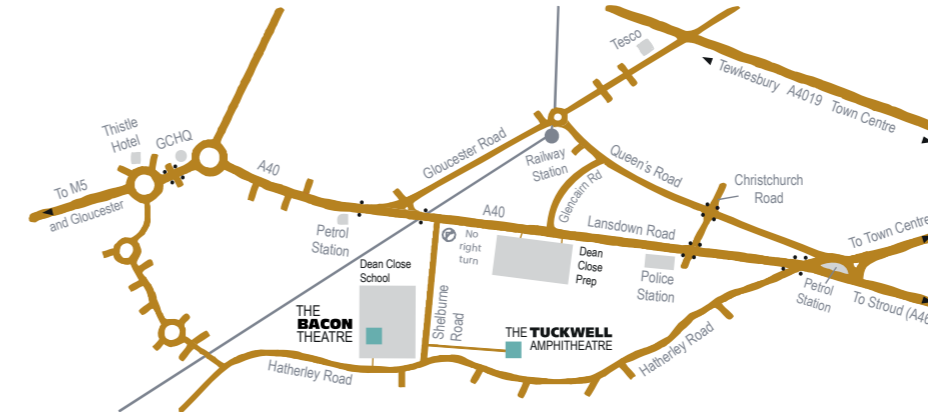
Cheltenham Spa railway station is a 15-minute walk away.
